What is Legionellosis?

Legionellosis is caused by the bacterium *Legionella pneumophila* and includes pneumonic form (Legionaires disease) and the non-pneumonic form (Pontiac Fever).

Symptoms:

Legionaires disease presents as pneumonia, with a dry non-productive cough and severe flu-like symptoms. It can occur sporadically as an uncommon cause of community-acquired pneumonia, or as cases associated with environmental sources such as hospitals, hotels and factories.
